**Draft Minutes of The Board of Directors Organizational and Regular Meeting**  
**Tuesday, January 16, 2018 at 6:00 PM**

**Type of Meeting: Organizational Meeting**

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by President Brown at 6:00 PM.

**Pledge of Allegiance:** The Pledge of Allegiance was delivered.

Prior to taking the roll call of directors, President Brown stated the Board needed to sort out who the directors are. He read section 5.2 of the Bylaws into the record. Only persons who are members in good standing of the association shall be eligible to be elected to or serve on the Board. Members deriving their membership through ownership of the Addendum A Property, are not eligible to serve on the Board. Only one owner of a particular lot may serve on the Board at any time. A person shall be deemed disqualified under the following circumstances; the person is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be of unsound mind or has been convicted of a felony; the person fails within sixty days after receiving notice of election to accept such office, either in writing or by attending a meeting of the Board of Directors as a director, the person is absent, without an excuse approved by the Board, from three consecutive meetings of the Board; or the person ceases to be an owner or ceases to be a member in good standing. He stated that there was a problem with Ronna and Ron Kaye serving on the Board at the same time because they are co-owners of more than one property. According to President Brown, only one of the Kayes can serve on the Board at a time.

Ron Kaye stated his opinion that one owner of a particular lot can serve on the Board at a time. Since they have more than one lot they can both serve on the Board at the same time. He will represent one lot and she will represent a different lot.

This exchange resulted in several heated exchanges between persons at the meeting. The disagreement continued for approximately 20 minutes, after which the Board took a break. When the meeting reconvened Ronna and Ron Kaye left the meeting.

**Roll Call of Directors:** No official roll call was made. Directors present: Rickie Brown, Ann Hutson, William Strickland, and Bill Six, with two vacant Board positions and Director Ronna Kaye leaving early.

**Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Signing of Ethics Policy:** President Brown read the Ethics Policy and asked if there were any questions. Board members present then signed the Ethics Policy.

**Appointment of Officers and Maintenance Supervisor for 2018:** This item was postponed until the next meeting.

**Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Appointment of Bank Account Signatories:** This item was postponed until the next meeting.

**Adjourn into Regular Meeting:** Meeting adjourned at 6:47 PM.

### **Type of Meeting: Regular Meeting**

**Call to Order** - The meeting was called to order at 6:48 PM.

**Roll Call of Directors** – Rickie Brown, Ann Hutson, William Strickland, and Bill Six were present, with two vacant Board positions and Director Ronna Kaye absent.

**Approval of Minutes** - Approval of Regular Board of Director's Meeting Minutes of November 21, 2017 and approval of Executive Session Meeting Minutes of November 21, 2017. Motion to approve minutes as presented made by Director Hutson and seconded by Director Six. Motion passed 4-0-0-1-1, with Director Ronna Kaye absent and two vacant Board positions.

**Open Forum:** A member suggested that the Board make the appointment of vacant Board positions based on the candidate who received the next highest number of votes in the last election. President Brown responded that we have a procedure that we follow, and the procedure includes informing the membership of the open positions. A member stated that in the past some Boards had used the prior election results to appoint vacant Board positions. A member asked about the front gate not closing. The community manager said she would investigate the gates not closing.

**Treasurer's Report:** The treasurer's report was delivered by Director Hutson. It was reported cash on hand was \$328,898, total receivables were \$55,707, loss for the month of December was (\$8,722) and net loss year-to-date as of December 31, 2017 was (\$26,386).

**Maintenance Report** – No maintenance report was delivered.

**Community Manager Report:** The community manager's report was delivered by Terri Bailey. She reported the new mailboxes would be installed on Monday, January 15th. There would be no mail delivery until Thursday, January 18th. It was reported that the new paint color for the clubhouse would be #8 Sausalito Ridge. There will be a workshop on the reserve study on Monday, February 12<sup>th</sup>, at 11:00 AM.

**Design Review:** No design reviews were submitted.

**Update of JVID Treated Water Project:** The community manager reported she had attended the JVID meeting and the water project was moving forward. The JVID Board approved the

contract to construct the remaining water pipeline and the water treatment plant. The contract will now be sent to the Regional Water Board for comment and final approval. Construction is expected to begin this spring. The Oaks Community will be the first to be connected to the water system.

**Discussion and Possible Action Related to Engagement of Schwartz, Giannini, Lantsberger & Adamson Accountancy Corporation for 2017 Annual Financial Review:** On a motion from Director Hutson and seconded by Director Six, the Board approved the engagement letter of Schwartz, Giannini, Lantsberger & Adamson Accountancy Corporation for 2017 Annual Financial Review.

**Discussion and Possible Action Related to Painting and Repairing the Exterior of the Clubhouse:** The Board approved hiring Debbie Saragossa as an employee to paint and make repairs to the clubhouse.

**Adjourn:** On a motion from Director Strickland and seconded by Director Hutson, the Board adjourned at 7:11 PM.

Minutes are in draft form until approved by The Board of Directors at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

Meetings are regularly scheduled for the Third Tuesday of the Month, at 6:00 PM in the clubhouse.

Agendas are in draft form until approved by the President of the Board. Two or more board members may also request an item be placed on the agenda.

In addition, The Oaks Community Association, generally has a policy of allowing members to place on items on the agenda for board discussion. Members should inform the Community Manager of their agenda request.

Once approved agendas are posted at both front doors to the clubhouse. As per the Davis-Stirling Act agendas, unless for an emergency meeting, must be posted 4 days in advance of the meeting.

Members also have an opportunity to address concerns during the monthly meeting in open forum. Open forum is for members to address the board on items not on the agenda.

## Update of Jackson Valley Water Project

I received the following email from Steve Fredricks, The General manager for Jackson Valley Irrigation District. Good News. It looks like the project is moving forward and construction should begin this spring. Hopefully we will be receiving our treated water from JVID before the end of summer.

Terri, there is nothing new I'm issuing the Notice to Proceed early next week. That will begin the construction project. The contractor already submitted some submittals for the treatment plant upgrades and would like to start on them possible in the next week or so. They have also moved in a cargo container into their primary laydown area to start moving in equipment. The pipeline does not have a schedule yet, but the latest start date will be April 15th earlier if the weather holds dry. They want to get going ASAP but would be required to do Storm Water Prevention Plans if before April 15th. The Board's policy committee did discuss at last night's meeting that they would like to meet and finalize some policies before the March meeting. Sorry for not getting you an update earlier I was out of the office all morning in different meetings.

Last Month we included the parking and vehicles rules. This month we are including the pet rules.

## **PETS**

1. All pets must be licensed by Amador County Animal Control and be current on all vaccinations.
2. All pets must be registered with The Oaks Community Association.
3. **EXCEPTION:** fish, caged birds, and small, harmless caged animals such as hamsters, etc.
4. Owners/tenants are responsible for pets of guests.
5. Pets (including but not limited to cats & dogs) shall not cause a disturbance or nuisance.
6. Pets (including cats & dogs) shall be kept on a leash within the community unless within a fenced yard.
7. Pet owners shall be responsible for cleaning up after their pet(s):
8. Clean up in the common areas shall be immediately.
9. Clean up of owners' own yard shall be not less than every few days.
10. For your convenience, several pet clean up stations are located within the community.
11. Not more than 2 (two) pets are allowed per household. The 2 (two) pets shall only be either: 2 cats, 2 dogs or, a combination of 1 cat & 1 dog.
12. Should a pet have a litter of puppies or kittens, the puppies or kittens shall be removed from the property within 60 (sixty) days of birth.
13. The maximum dog size allowed is 24 inches at shoulder height.
  - a. **EXCEPTION:**
    - i. properly designated service animals, and
    - ii. dogs acquired prior to January 1, 2003.
14. Any pet deemed to be aggressive will not be allowed to stay in the community and will be immediately reported to Amador county animal control.

## Trying Something New!!!

At the suggestion of a member we would like to try something new. I would like to start a conversation with the members by answering some of the questions you might have about the association. I am hoping that you all will help with this venture by submitting questions about the association to my email (terri.toca@att.net) or if you don't email you can drop your questions off at the office. When you submit your question please type question into the subject line.

To get us started I will submit a question that I get asked often:

**Who Runs Our Homeowner's Association?** The Oaks Community Association is managed by a 7-member Board of Directors. The Board is elected by the membership each January during the membership meeting. Board members serve two-year terms. The terms are staggered. On even year elections three Board seats are up for election. On odd years there are 4 Board seats up for election.

There are also 4 officers, president, vice president, secretary and treasurer. The officers are members of the Board and are selected each January by the Board members to serve a 1-year term.

There are no term limits for either the Board members or the officers. They can serve as many terms as they can be elected to serve.

The qualifications to be a member of the Board as outline in the Bylaws are as follow:

5.2 Qualification and Disqualification of Directors: Only persons who are Members in Good Standing of the Association shall be eligible to be elected to or serve on the Board. Members deriving their membership through ownership of the Addendum A Property, are not eligible to serve on the Board. Only one Owner of a particular Lot may serve on the Board at any time. A person shall be deemed disqualified under the following circumstances: (i) the person is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be of unsound mind or has been convicted of a felony; (ii) the person fails within sixty (60) days after receiving notice of election to accept such office, either in writing or by attending a meeting of the Board of Directors as a Director, (iii) the person is absent, without an excuse approved by the Board, from three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board; or (iv) the person ceases to be an Owner or ceases to be a Member in Good Standing.
