## Pool & Spa Rules

It's almost Summer time again and we thought we would remind you of the Pool & Spa Rules. We will soon have our Facility Supervisor on staff.

- Pool hours are 11:00 AM to 8:00 PM for general swimming. Lap times are 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM, and 8:00 PM to 9:00 PM.
- No smoking allowed.
- No persons wearing diapers are allowed in the pool or spa.
- No one under the age of 16 shall be permitted without a parent or responsible adult. A responsible adult is a person over 18 years old, with a signed authority from the minor's parent or guardian.
- No one under the age of 16 is allowed in the spa.
- Absolutely no glassware is allowed in the pool and spa areas.
- No food allowed.
- Only approved swim-wear shall be worn in the pool or spa.
- No hair clip or pins made of metal shall be worn in the pool or spa.
- No horseplay, diving, jumping into the pool, or running is allowed.
- No lifeguard is provided. Use of pool/spa is at the user's own risk.
- No wet swim suits are allowed in the clubhouse. Prior to use of the restroom facilities, please towel-dry yourself to avoid damage to the carpeted area.
- Any and all additional rules so posted in the area will be enforced.

### **Tools and Materials:**

Corks in various sizes, [save-on-crafts.com](http://save-on-crafts.com)

Teardrop ink pad

Regular ink pad

Note cards, envelopes, letter paper, gift tags, and/or labels

Fine-tip markers

How-To

1. Press a cork into an ink pad, then stamp it onto the paper.
2. Use fine-tip markers to draw details around the stamped circles: leaves on a radish, a stem on an orange, a pod for peas, and so on.
